Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India has informed that as per rules, only 10% of the total funds available under IAY during a year, can be carried forward to the next year. In case there is excess carryover of funds, deduction of proportionate central share of the amount exceeding 10% is made from the 2nd installment during the next year.

In light of this they have advised that all DRDAs should speed up the work to achieve utilization of at least 75% of total available funds by 31st December, 2009 to avoid deduction, on account of excess carry over of funds.

In this regard, you have requested to convey these instructions to all the concerned officers for immediate necessary action.

Dear Shri Narula,

As you are aware, as per rules, only 10% of the total funds available under IAY during a year, can be carried forward to the next year. In case there is excess carryover of funds, deduction of proportionate central share of the amount exceeding 10% is made from the 2nd instalment during the next year. However, during the year 2008-09 the funds of economic stimulus were allocated and released to the States in the month of February-March, 2009 and immediately after that Model Code of Conduct was imposed due to General Elections. In view of this, it has been decided that the deduction on account of excess carryover of funds will be ignored in case the DRDA has been able to utilize at least 75% of the total available funds during the current financial year by the end of December, 2009. The total available funds include the opening balance from the previous year plus the amount of first instalment of the current year as well as due State share.

I would, therefore, request you to advise all the DRDAs under your control to speed up the work to achieve utilization of at least 75% of total available funds by 31st December, 2009 to avoid deduction, if any, on account of excess carryover of funds.
